

# Cromarty Hydrogen Project Public Information Event

Welcome to the Cromarty Hydrogen Project Public Information Event.

ScottishPower, on behalf of the Cromarty Hydrogen Project, has submitted a planning application under Section 32 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 for the proposed construction and operation of an electrolyser plant and ancillary infrastructure (the 'Proposed Development') on land directly to the east of the existing Beinn Tharsuinn Windfarm, approximately 12km north of Alness. ScottishPower is undertaking this project with their joint development partner Storegga. This electrolyser plant would be powered by 100% renewable energy to produce green hydrogen by splitting water into hydrogen and oxygen using electrolysis.

This event will detail the proposals, including an outline of the project history and planning application process, feedback on how the site selection and design have evolved since the last public information events, a description of the final Proposed Development,

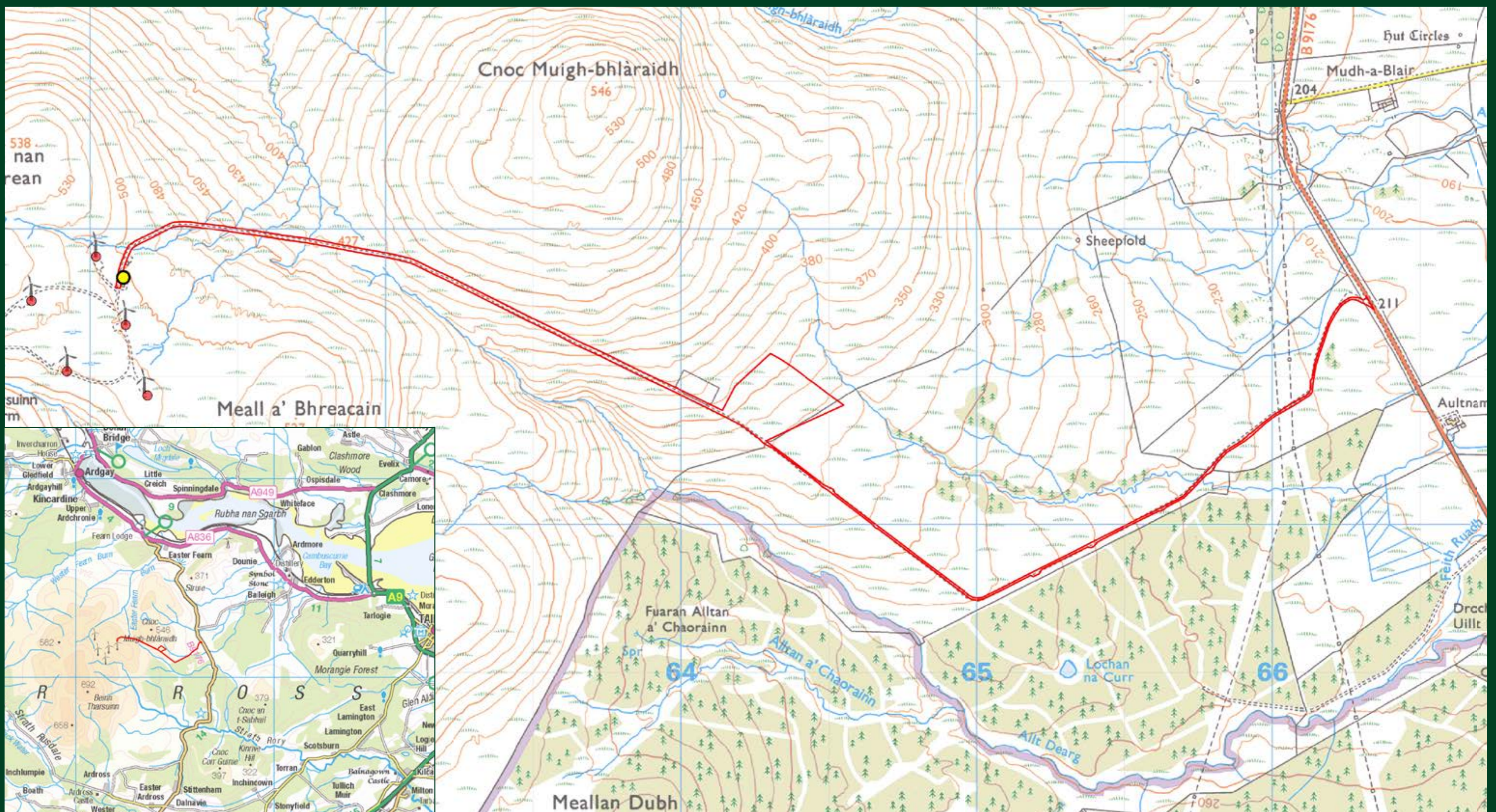
information on the benefits of the Proposed Development, and a summary of the results of the environmental surveys and appraisals.
